Images in Transition: Art and Politics in Chile's Transition to Democracy

Main topics: literature, arts, political issues, Chilean history.

What is this about?

This Global Seminar consists of a 6-week intensive course where you will be able to join 14 international students from Princeton University (US) who are eager to share and learn together with UDP students. This Global Seminar will take place at Universidad Diego Portales (UDP) between the end of June and the start of August. This seminar explores the connections between Chilean art and politics since the military coup of 1973 against President Salvador Allende, focusing on responses to censorship and repression by visual artists, filmmakers, performers, writers, and collectives, and considers the complex negotiations of the later democratic transition, the contemporary Chilean art and literary scenes, the implementation of neoliberalism, the feminist turn, the rise of recent political movements and the creation of a new constitution. Local excursions include urban public spaces used by artists as well as public and private art collections, library archives, film institutes, galleries and local museums. Students will have the opportunity to attend international symposia and other events commemorating the 50th anniversary of the military coup, where they will engage with renowned writers, artists, politicians, and scholars. The Seminar includes a field trip to San Pedro de Atacama and to Valparaís for the total groups of international and UDP students. All teachers are high profile international speakers and activities will be very much hands-on and interactive.

There are 5 full scholarships available for UDP students from **any** discipline that cover all costs of the program, a unique opportunity to internationalize your academic career without leaving UDP campus!
